








What are my chances of getting prostate cancer?




√2nd leading cause of cancer death in American men

71 in 6 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime

If locally confined, 5-yr survival rate is 100%

In case of metastasis, 5-yr survival rate is 35%




Chances of getting prostate cancer: HIGH

Prostate is...


A sex gland in men

Size of a walnut

Responsible for producing fluid that sperm travels in

O Located in front of the rectum, below the bladder

Wraps around the urethra











Prostate Cancer Risk Factors



Age

If you live long enough you will get prostate cancer



Race

African American men → 60% more likely to have prostate cancer

Asian men → Less likely to have prostate cancer

Family History

 2 relatives with prostate cancer → 5 times the risk

 3⁺ relatives with prostate cancer → guaranteed to have prostate cancer



Lifestyle Choice

Obesity

Tlittle physical activity

♂ Smoking

Thigh intake of fatty foods

Prostate Cancer Symptoms

Early Stages

CAN BE ASYMPTOMATIC

- Aching pains in genitals, lower abdomen, lower back Problems with sexual function
 - **T**Painful, frequent, urgent urination
 - **Slow** urine stream and retention
 - **M** Blood in the urine

Advanced Stages

- ♂Loss of energy
- **OPersistent swelling in legs**
- Pain in the back, spine, rib or hip
 - Hard growth on prostate
 - **TEnlarged lymph nodes**










But I'm in great shape and don't feel sick Do I *really* need my prostate examined?



He will try to feel for enlargement, lumps and tenderness of the prostate

Prostate Cancer Detection Stage 1: Annual Digital Rectal Exam

Early detection of prostate cancer is VITAL for survival








Prostate Cancer Detection

Stage 2: Prostate Specific Antigen

(PSA) Testing

Or Cell activity in theprostate produces PSA

Higher than average PSA levels in the bloodstream is a sign of abnormal cell multiplication in the prostate








Prostate Cancer Detection Stage 3: Prostate Biopsy



A thin needle is inserted into suspect areas and small sections of tissue are retrieved for analysis

Early stage: Locally confined cancer

Locally advanced: spread to seminal vesicles

Advanced: spread to bladder, rectum, spine





Watchful Waiting







For: Early stage, slow growing, localized cancer

Procedure: Monitor growth regularly






Radical Prostatectomy




For: Stages I & II, accelerated growth

O Procedure: Surgical removal of the entire prostate

♂ Procedure: ~ 3 hours, invasive












Laparoscopic Radical Prostatectomy





Less invasive, faster recovery









Prostate Brachytherapy




For: Stages I & II, accelerated growth

Templates and ultrasound guidance are used to place radioactive seeds/catheters into the prostate to irradiate the gland

♂ Procedure:

~ 1 hours, minimally invasive







Other Treatments



Treatment	Stage	Description	Duration
External Beam	Any stage	X-rays directed from external source	30mins, 7-8 weeks, not invasive
Cryosurgery	Reserved for salvage	Nitrogen to freeze prostate cells	1 hour, minimally invasive
Thermal Ablation	Under research	HIFU to burn prostate cells	3 hours, very invasive
Hormonal (chemo) therapy	Late stage, metastasis	Chemicals used to slow progression	Indefinite, life long, not invasive
