perception, bliss, and energy.


-Who have given us the path of Liberation, which brings an end to the cycle of birth, life, death and suffering.




Siddha: 8 Virtues





Obeisance to the Preceptors (Spiritual masters and guides).



I bow to all Sädhus and Sädhvis who strictly follow the five great vows of conduct and inspire us to live a simple life.



Eso pancanamokkaro, savvapavappanasano Mangalnam cha savvesim, padhamam havai mangalam | |

This five-fold obeisance is destructive of all sins and is the foremost amongst all the auspicious.

To these five types of great souls, I offer my praise.

Such praise will help diminish my negative vibrations and sins. Offering this praise is most auspicious of all benedictions.



Arihanta means pure soul with body - has 12 virtues

- Siddhas are liberated souls 8 virtues
- Acharyas are leader of the monks 36 virtues
 - Upadhyayas teach jain scriptures 25 virtues -Monks and nuns - 27 virtues

-There are 108 beads in mala (Rosary)
-Which is total virtues of five supreme beings.





A (Arihant) + A (Ashariri-Siddha) + AA (Aacharya) + U (Upadhaya) + M (Muni) Ashariri = Without Body =A+A+AA+U+M = A..U..M

The First Alphabets of five supreme souls makes the word AUM or OM



Shree Navkar Mantra is also Known as "Namokar Mantra".

It is one of the most important hymn
for the people practicing Jainism.

It is the respect to five supreme beings.

Namely, Arihanta, Siddha, Acharya, Upadhdhyay, and Sadhus.

Collectively, they are called five supreme beings (Panch Parmesthi).

So This mantra is also called "PanchParmesthi Namskar"
or simply "Namskar Mantra".



This Mantra or Prayer can be recited at any time.

we do not specifically pray to any person.

We pray to supreme virtues.

We do not ask anything in return.

It reminds us that we have to become like the five supreme beings.



In this mantra we worship virtues rather than worshipping any one particular person; therefore, this Mantra is not named after any individual.

In this sense, It is "Universal Prayer".
